Water Resources Sanitary Sewer Projects

The Water Resources Construction Division will be replacing sanitary sewer mains in the street right-of-way on the following streets:

- King Street from Cherry Street to Skyway Drive
- Winchester Avenue from Beard Street to Hill Street
- Winchester Avenue from Stafford Street to Hill Street

Weather permitting, work will begin Monday, January 8, 2024 and will take approximately six weeks to complete.

Temporary road closures will be necessary within the project limits. Therefore, it is suggested that alternate routes be considered. Emergency service vehicle access will be provided at all times. Normal collection of garbage and residential/commercial deliveries will be provided access.

All damaged/disturbed items will be restored or replaced at the end of the project. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience experienced during construction.
