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PROCLAMATION RECISSION OF DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY P-2022-10

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic impacted the City of Monroe since the pandemic began in March of 2020; and

WHEREAS, Roy Cooper, the Governor of the State of North Carolina, declared a state of emergency on March 10, 2020 through the issuance of Executive Order 116; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, Mayor Bobby G. Kilgore issued P-2020-04, a Declaration of a State of Emergency and on March 24, 2020, Mayor Bobby G. Kilgore amended the Declaration, by issuing P-2020-05 in accordance with Section 37.10 of the City of Monroe Code of Ordinances which permits the Mayor to issue superseding and amended proclamations as needed; and

WHEREAS, on December 13, 2021, Marion L. Holloway, Jr. was sworn in as Mayor of the City of Monroe; and

WHEREAS, on July 11, 2022, Governor Roy Cooper announced that he would end the state of emergency he declared on March 10, 2020; and

WHEREAS, it appears to be an appropriate time for the City of Monroe to end its emergency declaration.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as the Mayor of the City of Monroe under Article 1A of Chapter 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes and Chapter 37 of the City of Monroe Code of Ordinances, I, Marion L. Holloway, Mayor of the City of Monroe take the following actions:

1. The Declaration of a State of Emergency within the corporate limits of the City of Monroe contained within P-2020-04, and amended by P-2020-05, is hereby rescinded; and;
2. This rescission shall be effective as of 5:00 p.m. on August 15, 2022.
