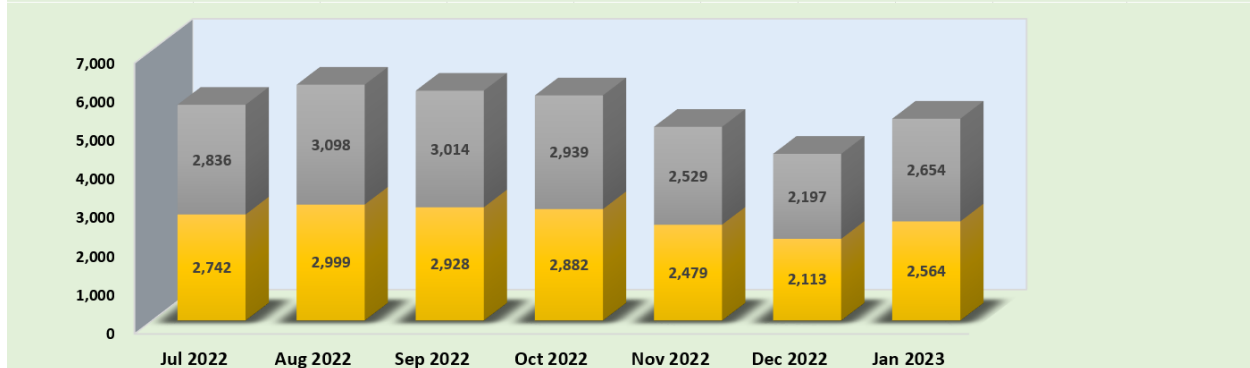

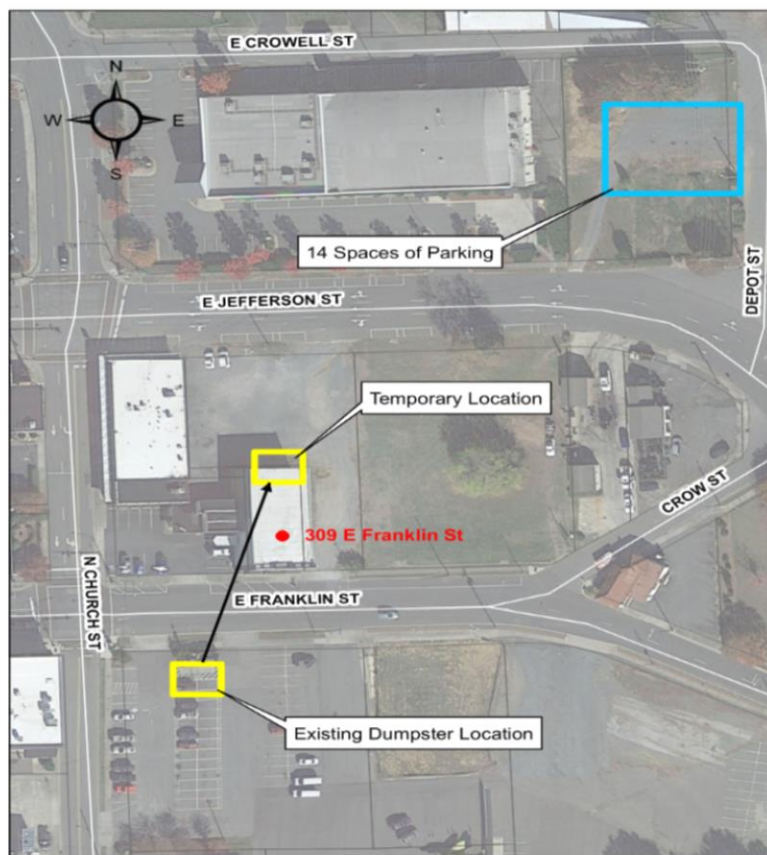

The City of Monroe has awarded a contract for the Monroe Science Center Honoring Dr. Christine Mann Darden parking lot improvements to Hux Contracting, LLC. The notice to proceed for the project will be issued on March 1, 2023 and contract time will expire on July 28, 2023

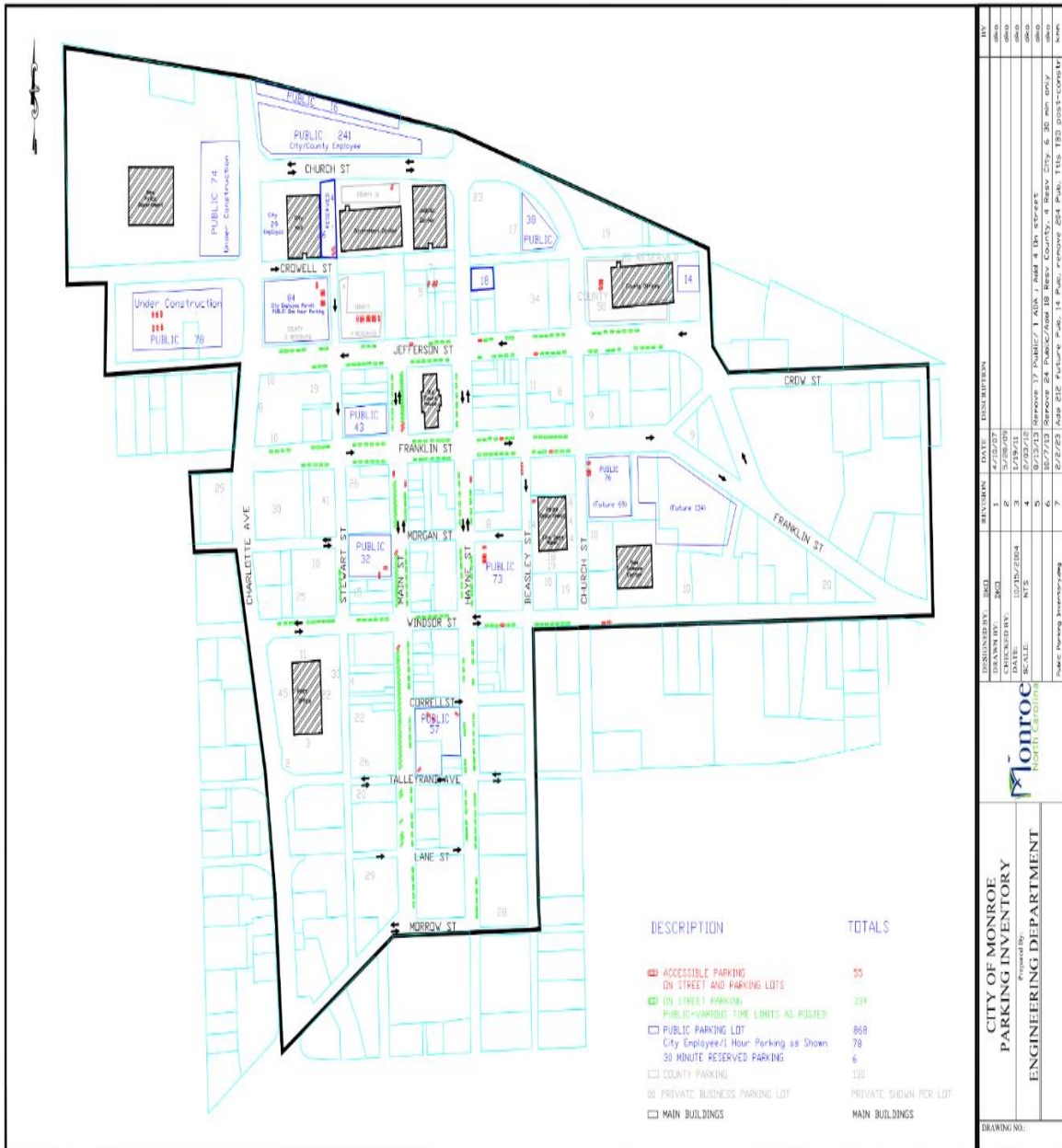
During this time, the dumpsters located at the corner of Church Street and Franklin Street will be relocated for Downtown businesses to have access to dispose of their trash and recycling. On February 28, 2023, the dumpsters will be moved across the street to a temporary location. They will be located behind the building at 309 E. Franklin Street. Follow-up communication will be provided once the dumpsters are moved back to the Church Street/Franklin Street location.

Underwater Recovery Equipment

Union County Emergency Management has purchased an underwater Remote Operated Vehicle (ROV) to aid in the recovery process following a drowning. Monroe's Swift Water Rescue Team leaders recently trained with Union County personnel on this equipment. The ROV will be utilized in conjunction with Monroe's water rescue team to locate and recover drowning victims. Water rescue team members are able to search an area from boats using underwater sonar type equipment to locate a drowning victim. The ROV, which can be operated from a boat, could then be deployed to recovery the body. In the past, this operation required assistance from the Charlotte Fire Department to provide this specialized equipment. Monroe personnel, along with Union County personnel, have conducted initial training on the unit which included classroom basic operations and underwater deployments. The ROV will go into service soon and will be a great addition to our Monroe and Union County partnership in water rescue and recovery.

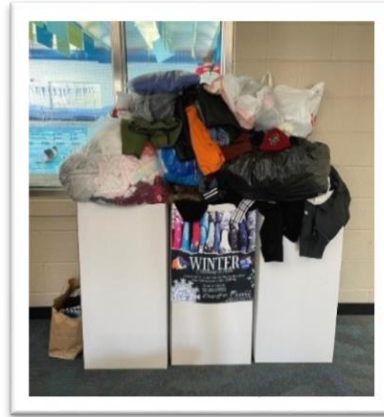
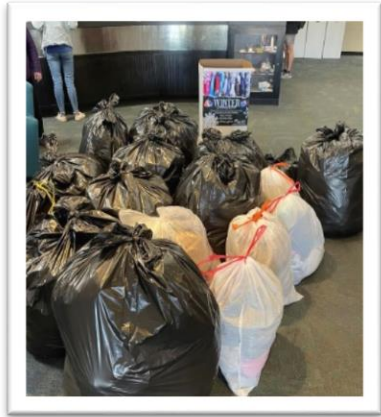

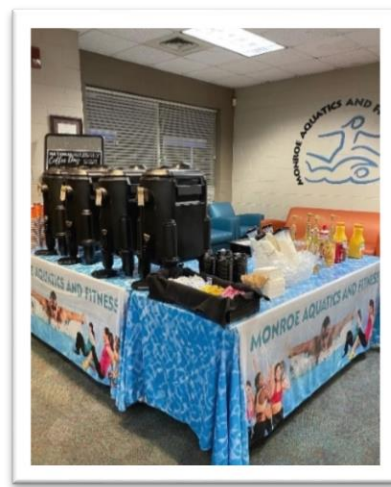

SEASONAL LOOSE LEAF COLLECTION – OCTOBER 17, 2022 – FEBRUARY 24, 2023

This is a friendly reminder, seasonal loose leaf collection begins October 17, 2023. The City of Monroe's leaf trucks operate weekdays during this time. City residents can expect their leaf piles vacuumed up at least every 10-14 days, but this cycle can be affected by both weather and the volume of leaves. Residents must place leaf piles at the edge of their yard above the curb, free from foreign debris and away from potential obstructions, while still being within the reach of the leaf trucks. Foreign debris is anything that is not leaves such as limbs, vines, rocks and trash, as these items can damage the vacuum equipment. Obstructions include, but are not limited to parked vehicles, mailboxes, fire hydrants, utility boxes, fences, trees and landscaping. Due to the risk of damage, leaf piles too close to obstructions, or mixed with foreign debris CANNOT be collected. 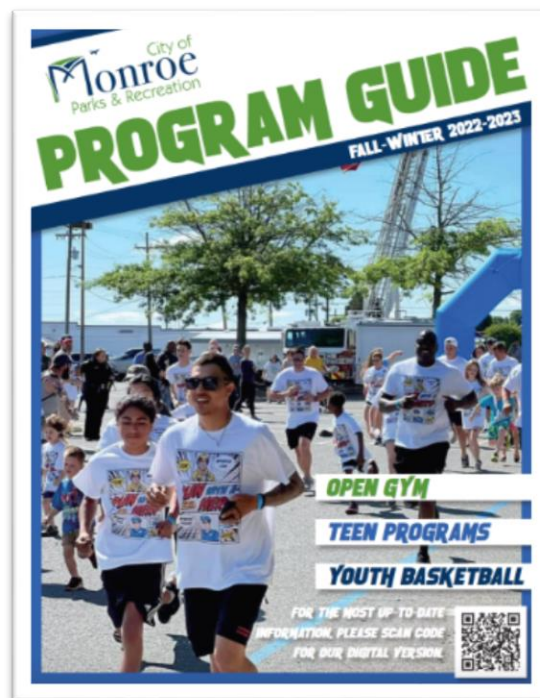
