Parks Maintenance

SEASONAL LOOSE LEAF COLLECTION – OCTOBER 17, 2022 – FEBRUARY 24, 2023

This is a friendly reminder, seasonal loose leaf collection ENDS February 24, 2023. The City of Monroe's leaf trucks operate weekdays during this time. City residents can expect their leaf piles vacuumed up at least every 10-14 days, but this cycle can be affected by both weather and the volume of leaves. Residents must place leaf piles at the edge of their yard above the curb, free from foreign debris and away from potential obstructions, while still being within the reach of the leaf trucks. Foreign debris is anything that is not leaves such as limbs, vines, rocks and trash, as these items can damage the vacuum equipment. Obstructions include, but are not limited to parked vehicles, mailboxes, fire hydrants, utility boxes, fences, trees & landscaping. Due to the risk of damage, leaf piles too close to obstructions, or mixed with foreign debris CANNOT be collected. The Sunset Park shelter construction is near completion. The NEW Dog Park located at Sunset Park will also be open in the near future. Once completed, a ribbon cutting will take place.



The Parks Maintenance Division has been working on the installation of inclusive playground amenities at various parks. The picture below depicts a new inclusive see-saw at Don Griffin Park.



There are multiple projects throughout our park system this year. All projects are scheduled to be complete by the end of this fiscal year. These projects include:

Belk Tonawanda Park Renovation – The bottom portion was completed in June. This portion of the project included new paths that provide better accessibility, the renovation and relocation of the bocce courts, an outdoor fitness station, permanent outdoor cornhole boards and table tennis tables. The top portion that includes the splash pad, bathroom and shelter is schedule for completion prior to the Summer season.

We are in the process of adding cameras to this park in partnership with the Energy Services and IT Departments. These cameras will assist in promoting a safe and inviting environment to this park. We have also partnered with the Police to provide park monitors on a regular basis to ensure this park is being utilized appropriately.

Dickerson Park Renovations – This renovation is complete and included the upgrade of the outdoor basketball courts and the complete renovation of the restroom facilities at the park. A further renovation will include the relocation of several disc golf holes into the wooded area on the park property. The disc golf course upgrade should be in process soon and should open in the Spring. The bathrooms are currently open to the public.

Don Griffin Park Playground Renovation – This playground renovation was completed in February. This renovation includes an additional section of playground that encourages cooperative play, as well as, a more “active” approach to play. Included in this renovation are two inclusive components that are located within the playground footprint.

Sunset Park Renovation – This renovation includes a new dog park which will be ready to open soon. The ribbon cutting ceremony date will be announced in the near future. Also included in this renovation is an upgrade to the outdoor basketball courts and a new shelter available for reservation. The basketball courts opened for play in the late fall. The shelter will be available for rental soon, as well.

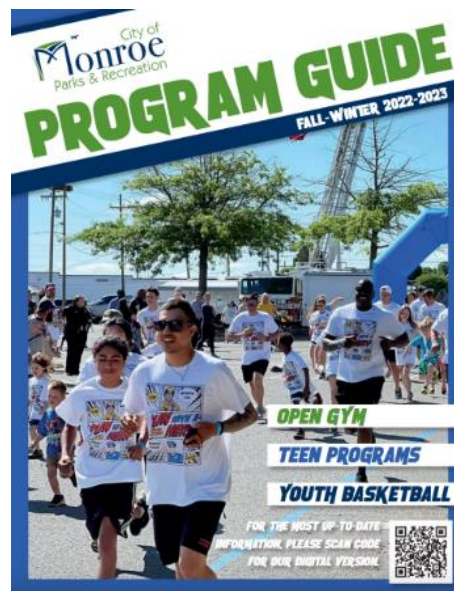
Creft Park Renovations – This renovation will include a new playground and the upgrade of the outdoor basketball courts. The playground replacement project should begin in March and, barring

any unforeseen obstacles, open to the public in March, as well. The outdoor basketball courts opened for play in late fall.

Inclusive Playground Equipment – We have made inclusivity at playgrounds and within programs a priority when planning for future renovation of parks and program offerings. We will be adding an [expression swing universal](#) (click to check it out) to Belk Tonawanda Park and Dickerson Park along with a [Sensory Wave Climber Ground Level “S”](#) (click to check it out) at Belk Tonawanda Park that assists those with mobility needs in enjoying our park amenities.

Planning Division

New Commercial Development/Projects:

- New Cocktail Lounge titled Local Logic Beer Co. located at 128 S. Main Street in Downtown Monroe has been issued their Certificate of Occupancy (CO) and will be opening soon.
- Collins Aerospace located at 1310 Airport Road has been issued their Certificate of Occupancy (CO) issued for an 18,000 square foot addition for a new additive manufacturing center and expansion of global repair capabilities
- A new Sports Clips coming to the new Windmere Shopping Center across from Target located at 2854 W. Highway 74.

New Residential Development/Projects:

Erosion Control Permits provide approval for ground disturbing activity; it is the first step in developing a site and preparing it for infrastructure and building. Erosion Control Permits have been issued for the following projects:

- Secrest Meadows – Single-family residential development located at Secrest Shortcut Road near Roanoke Church Road and adjacent to the Hilton Meadows Subdivision. While approved for 135 single family lots through the rezoning process, the development has been reduced to 129 lots through the erosion control permitting process.
- Wellington, Phase 1 – A 256 lot single-family residential development located off Deese Road. The erosion control permitting is being completed in phases; the first phase includes 159 lots.
- Ashton Park – Single-family residential development located off Olive Branch Road, just before the Monroe Expressway. While approved for 81 single family lots through the rezoning process, the development has been reduced to 72 lots through the erosion control permitting process.

Boards and Commission Open Seats

The Board of Adjustment and Historic District Commission have open seats. Please note if you are interested in serving on one of these boards, you must be a City resident and you must attend at least two meetings prior to applying to serve as well as submit a resume. The application is on

The Board of Adjustment is a quasi-judicial board. This Board hears and makes decisions on Special Use Permits, Variances, and Appeals. There is a Board of Adjustment meeting on February 23, 2023 for those interested.

The Historic District Commission makes quasi-judicial decisions on matters within the Historic District. You must either live in the district or have a demonstrated special interest, experience, or education in history, architectural, archaeology or related fields to serve on this Commission. There is a Historic District Commission meeting on March 13, 2023 for those interested.
