

Historic Monroe, NC

Architectural Scavenger Hunt



Constructed between 1847 and 1848, this structure served as the public Jail. The oldest public building in Union County, it was sold to the City of Monroe in 1892.



Built in 1903, this Neo-Classical home served as residence to one of the operators of one of the largest chains of department stores in the Southeast.



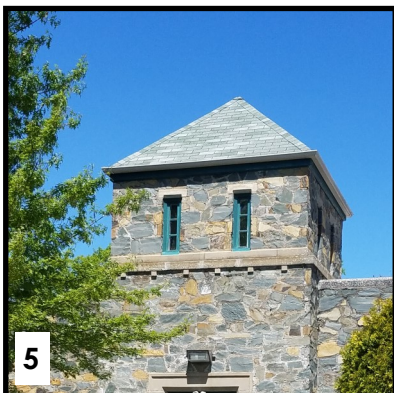
Constructed in 1913, this structure, supported by its Corinthian columns, indicated the growing importance of Monroe as a trading, industrial, and railroad center.



After rebuilding their retail store in 1927 after being destroyed by a fire, the owning company built this structure in 1928 adjacent to their warehouse.



Constructed in 1898, this Queen Anne Home dawns semi-circle spindle screens attached to the columns of the porch, forming oval and circular patterns above the railing.



Constructed in 1939, this structure was used by troops in WW2 and was the headquarters for the National Guard until 1977.



Constructed in 1906, this structure helped Monroe become a major freight stop especially for industrial development. It also allowed Monroe to be a connecting link to New York, New Orleans, and Atlanta
