

SPECIALIZED UNITS

The Monroe Police Department utilizes specialized units which provide a full range of services to the community:

Special Response Team (SRT)

The members of this team are ready to respond to high risk incidents using specialized tactics, training, equipment, and weapons.



Community Intervention Team (CIT)

Officers with this assignment directly interact with community leaders and citizens in order to determine areas in need of concentrated law enforcement resources. The CIT purpose also includes strategic planning and follow up in order to combat public concerns.



Traffic Safety and Enforcement Unit

These officers are trained in traffic education and advanced traffic accident investigation. They also provide traffic education programs to schools, churches and other organizations.

OVERVIEW

The Monroe Police Department takes great pride in the professionalism it extends to the community it serves. The Department is currently accredited through the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) to improve and maintain its high level of professionalism. The Monroe Police Department currently consists of 87 sworn officers and 16 civilian employees. Located in the center of Union County and approximately 25 miles from Charlotte.



EQUIPMENT

Police Officers are outfitted with the latest technology to assist them in their daily activities. When officers successfully complete the Field Training Program they are assigned a take-home vehicle. Each patrol vehicle is equipped with a shotgun, video camera, and laptop computer. Officers are also outfitted with uniforms and duty gear.

ORGANIZATION STRUCTURE

ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION

Responsible for personnel, records, training, recruitment, equipment and uniform inventories, computer services, vehicle maintenance and purchasing, and other special services, such as DARE, School Resource officers, and traffic safety and education.

INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION

Responsible for the investigation of crimes such as murder, robbery, rape, burglary, serious assaults, juvenile crimes, narcotics activity and other crimes that warrant an in-depth investigation.

PATROL DIVISION

Uniformed patrol officers are first line responders to any and all calls for service. These officers are seen through high visibility patrol and enforcement of traffic laws. Four Public Information Clerks are also assigned to the patrol division. All patrol officers participate in community policing.
